(X) Name given to commemorate his friend Captain Chaillet of Neufchâtel. Bush, or small tree indigenous to Cayenne, particularly remarkable for the position of its flowers, which grow on the petiole of the leaves. Yellow branches, somewhat angular and covered with a down so fine that it is difficult to see it even with a magnifying glass. Leaves are alternate, on a short petiole, oval and elongated into points, smooth and pinnate-veined. Flowers are small and grow invariably at the top of the petiole, which is thicker among the leaves which bear flowers. Has identified two types of this bush:

Chailletia pedunculata, Chailletia sessiliflora.
