The bark of 3 trees was used by Bancroft for dyeing. In each case he gives the place of origin of the tree, its local name, botanical name, by Linnaeus or other botanist and short description in Latin. The bark is also described of:

- 1) Quercus nigra - yellow or black oak. Gronovius description in Flora Virginica.
- 2) Juglans alba - (Linnaeus). American hiccory or walnut. Gronovius description in Flora virginica.
- 3) Rhizophora Mangle (Linnaeus). Red mangrove - description of Sloane, Ray and other
