- (X) Uncultivated vegetables, with locations and a little description used as food by Indians and immigrants:
- 1) Phytolacca decandra- around Philadelphia
 - 2) A species of wild cabbage named by Muhlenberg, Brassica Washitana, Washita R. & Arkansas territory
 - 3) ^sCapella bursa pastoris, Philadelphia
 - 4) Hydrophyllum virginicum, Western States (which ever they were then)
 - 5) Apios tuberosa, many parts of the U.S.
 - 6 & 7) Bulbs of the Quamash (Scilla esculenta, Bot. Mag., 1574; Nuttall's Phalangium esculentum, and tubers of Psoralia esculenta.
