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Notes ^(P) Translation of an article by Crawford in the ^a Calcutta Government Gazette, 1st March 1827. ^(X) Deputation sent to the Burmese court with a view to establishing trade relations between the Burmese and the British. Included ^{newspaper} Dr. Wallich, superintendent of the Botanic Garden at Calcutta. The most successful part of the survey was from the botanical point of view. Wallich stayed at Amherst and collected 16,000 specimens of plants, 500 of which were new, amongst them, 7 species of oak, 2 of walnut, 1 rose, 3 willows. Other new plants included one he named Amherstia. Discovered and described the tree which produces varnish. Other trees growing there teak, Hopea odorata and Herietera robusta.
