Other Useful Arts 24 (139): 529-533. 1795 [Dec?], article by Thomas Whitesmith) as Trifolium Ochrolucum, as described in Curtis's Flora Londiniensis, no. 69 (plate 69?) The clover was grown on the farm of William Nicholson. In 1792 he spread a field, hitherto in grass, with the scapings of a turnpike road; in the June following he saw the clover.
