Notes Hamilton had received from Vittoria, Caracas, seeds of a new type of wheat which, in South America, germinated and matured very rapidly - this he communicated to the Society of Agriculture in London and sent seeds to Loudon. Many English agronomists thought that the plant would acclimatise to a cooler climate, but Loudon disagreed saying that in a temperate climate the plant would not reach its full maturity.
