Hove's remarks on a paper on woods and plantations sent to him by the Board of Agric. and in addition remarks on the plantations of trees he met during the course of his travels in Europe: 3 varieties of oak in Poland, Quercus, Cerris, and another variety he met with only around the River Bug; short description of this variety, or rather the leaves and acorns, and bark. Suggests trees which would do well in England: Swirk (species of fir), the White ash from the Belsk district and also a species of maple; a new and unknown species of Black birch. Lastly gives observation on plantations exposed to strong winds.
