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Notes Outline of the origins and history of publication of Flora danica, which at that time had reached part 27 only, having been started about 50 years before. Professor Oeder had commenced the work after a 5-year botanical expedition in Norway. His plan had been to include all plants growing wild in Danish possessions. 10 parts appeared during his time as editor. After his death Wahl (Vahl?) continued the work, thereafter Hornemann. The 27 parts which had appeared contained 1000 phanerogamous plants and 600 cryptogams. In spite of the slowness of publication the work had provided a useful example since no sooner had it started publication than analogous publications in other countries had appeared, e.g. the flora of Austria, by Jacquin, that of Russia by Pallas, of England by Curtis and that of Holland by Kops.
