Notes New plants in flower:

Tetragonia echinata, Spring. Sent from Botanic Garden of Halle].

Cufea procumbens, Ort. - orig. S. America. Seeds given by Radel.

Anoda crenatifolia, Ort. S. America. Sent by the Professor of Botany at the School at Barcelona.

Ageratum punctatum, Ort. -orig, S. America- seeds sent by Ortega.

A. pedatum, Ort. -orig. S. America. [Corrected in 1801/1802. I(1) p.1-6 as being Salvia pedata. J.E.N].

Anthirrinum medium - sent from Milan by Filippo Armano.

A. triornophorum,

Crepis leontodioides, All. - recently discovered in the Andes and described by Allioni.

Nicotiana cerinthioides, Vitman. Sent from Milan by Vitman.

Oenothera odorata, Jacq. No pl. origin.

Echinops ... new species - about 5 ft high, with sky blue flowers - plant brought

back by Brugière & Olivier from Asia Minor.

Cosmos pinnatifida, new genus instituted by Cavanilles - orig. Peru, seeds sent by Cavanilles.

Tricosanthes anguina - S. America, brought back by Baudin.

Malpighia coccigera, Lin. - Puerto Rico, brought back by Baudin.

In addition several Broussonetia papyrifera. The first trees of this species were introduced into England in 1759 into the gardens of the Duke of Northumberland.

Article ends with the importation and gradual acclimatization of Broussonetia papyrifera in the Jardin des Plantes, including those brought from Cayenne, and others from London.
