Notes Discovered in 1818 in Sumatra by Dr. J. Arnold, the flower belongs to a new species called Rafflesia, coming between Aristolochia and Passiflora, according to Professor R. Brown. It measures, when fully opened, 3 ft. in diameter and weighs 15 pounds.
